8.2 REQUEST TO **MINISTRY** OF **TRANSPORTATION** TO **ENFORCE ITS** REGULATIONS RELATED TO ILLEGAL **TRAILER** SIGNAGE IN THE **HIGHWAY 400 CORRIDOR**

8.3 PARKING PASS FOR RESIDENTS IN THE VICINITY OF THE ALLANDALE WATERFRONT GO STATION (WARD 8)

That staff in Traffic/Access Barrie investigate the feasibility of implementing a resident parking permit/pass, specifically for residents in the Allandale area, bound by Gowan Street to the north, Holgate Street to the south, Essa Road to the west, and Robinson Street to the east (currently an area covered by a parking prohibition between the hours of 7:00 a.m. - 9:00 a.m., within proximity to the Allandale Waterfront GO Station) and report back to General Committee with the following information:

- a) The potential to make the parking permit/pass available on a voluntary basis for qualifying area residents to pick up at either the Allandale Recreation Centre or City Hall, with a limit of two passes/permits per household provided free of charge with the use of such permit/pass subject to normal winter control parking prohibitions; and
