## Barrie hosting manufacturing summit for industry experts 'City making a name for itself in evolving industry'

(Barrie, ON) Manufacturing industry experts from across the province will gather at Barrie's first Manufacturing Innovation Summit on April 20, at the Performing Arts Centre in Barrie (1 Dunlop Street West). The conference is being co-hosting by the City of Barrie, Georgian College and ventureLAB.
