Prowse has 21 years of management experience in the private sector, leading to his current role as an executive with G&K Services Canada Inc. In this current role, Prowse oversees 8 corporate facilities and more than 350 personnel, with direct responsibility for strategic planning and all operational matters from staffing to health and safety. In 2016 and again in 2017, he was recognized by G&K as the top general manager in North America; in part for driving innovative improvements to service and reducing staff turnover. His more than two decades of experience spans HR, corporate infrastructure, project management, labour relations, and budgets.
