SUBJECT:	Requested information	

During the Barrie Public Library's 2018 budget presentation, City Councillors requested additional information. This request concerned library performance and staffing levels.

Comparative analysis with other libraries is difficult because standardization in reporting at the provincial level is not complete. For example: 1) some libraries underreport programming numbers because of varying definitions of what counts as a program; and 2) some local governments do not consider certain facilities costs as part of the library's budget. This means that some statistical comparisons are more reliable than others. We have made an effort to focus numbers that are more reliable.

Barrie Public Library belongs to a peer group of 18 libraries, each serving a population between 100,000 and 250,000 people. These are the libraries we have used for comparative purposes.

1. Number of Facilities

It was mentioned during the budget presentation that the Barrie Public Library has the fewest service points per 10,000 population. This is demonstrated below:

2. Key Performance Indicators

Barrie Public Library ranks in the middle when comparing circulation on a per capita basis. In this case, for each member of the population served, 9.75 items are checked out.

A very important metric for all libraries is turnover rate. In this case, the Barrie Public Library performs well in that each item in its physical collection circulates 7.27 times in a year.

The Barrie Public Library performs below average for program attendance at 0.256. The average would be 0.292. This is partly due to lack of facilities as well as the need to track numbers more accurately:

3. Staffing

The following is a breakdown of the Barrie Public Library's current staffing complement. This number represents a snapshot in time and is subject to minor fluctuations due to resignations and gapping. No additional staffing has been budgeted for from 2017 to 2018:

While Barrie Public Library stands in the middle with respect to the number of FTE, it is 15th out of the 18 libraries in its peer group for the percentage of funds spent on salaries and benefits. This means that a greater percentage of its budget is spent on facilities and services as opposed to staffing relative to comparator libraries:
