I, JEFF LEHMAN, Mayor of the City of BARRIE,

do hereby proclaim

November 15, 2018

as

Pancreatic Cancer Day

WHEREAS; In 2018, an estimated 5,500 people will be diagnosed with pancreatic cancer in Canada

and 93 percent will eventually die from the disease; and

WHEREAS; Pancreatic cancer has the lowest survival rate of all major cancers, and just 7 percent

of those diagnosed survive five years or longer; and

WHEREAS: Pancreatic cancer is the seventh most common cause of cancer-related death across

the world; and

WHEREAS; It is estimated that by 2020, 480,000 new cases will be diagnosed globally; and

WHEREAS: The good health and well-being of the residents of Barrie are enhanced as a direct result

of increased awareness about the risks and symptoms of pancreatic cancer, and

research into early detection, causes, and effective treatments.

THEREFORE, I, Jeff Lehman, Mayor of the City of Barrie, do hereby proclaim November 15, 2018 as

"Pancreatic Cancer Day" in the City of Barrie.
