Project Financing Update

- Overall project costs are being finalized and final project costs are anticipated to be presented in June.
- This project is currently included in the City's 10 year capital plan under the following projects:
 - FC1020 First Responders Campus New Building Development
 - Z268 BFES Permanent Training Facility Development
 - FC1010 BPS Police Services Accommodations (Land Purchase)
- Funds have previously been approved and committed for the land purchase.



Project Financing Update

- Total costs identified for the above projects in the City's Budget total approximately \$81 M based on previous project estimates. Includes \$13.7M county allocation
- In 2017 dollars, City's budget estimate is approximately \$76.5M excluding land costs. The County's capital Budget includes an additional \$21.4M
- The Capital Forecast identifies the sources of funding as approx.
 22% Development Charges, 60% Tax funding (Tax Capital Reserve or Debentures) and 18% funding from the County of Simcoe
- Of the tax funding \$2.6M of dedicated police funding has already been contributed to the Tax Capital Reserve
- City will be responsible for 25% of Simcoe County's tax-based funding share
