Barrie Transit

There will be no Barrie Transit service on Friday, April 7 or Sunday, April 9. Transit will run regular weekday service on Monday, April 10. Riders are encouraged to plan their transit trips using MyRideBarrie.ca.

Curbside Collection

There will be no garbage, organics, recycling or yard waste collection on Friday, April 7. It will take place on the next day (Saturday). Collection will take place as usual on Monday, April 10.
