


History of BCRY

- In 2011, ACDC was dissolved as fully independent non-profit corporation. This was accompanied by the sale of the Newmarket Subdivision and Allendale Yard to Metrolinx.
- Collingwood terminates rail service from Utopia to Collingwood effective July15/11, and exited from its agreements with BCRY effective Oct 15/11
- The Town of Collingwood remained owner and rail authority for all Rail properties west of the CP MacTier Subdivision (Utopia, ON).
- The City of Barrie continues to own and operate 22 miles of active rail within Innisfil, Barrie and Essa Township
- Barrie owned rail interested were incorporated into the City of Barrie Management Structure for the 2012 Budget year.
- The budget is subsidised by the City of Barrie, the Operation of the Railway split between RPF and Engineering Departments.
- Cando Rail Service operates the BCRY in accordance with the Railway Safety Act.




BCRY Rail Network

Budget Expenditure

- Where is money being spent in 2016
 - Operation of rail: \$166,000
 - Minor Capital: \$105,000
 - Threshold: \$594,000
- BCRY entered into a new contract with Cando Rail Services in 2015
 Cost increases to operation of railway as a result in Federal
 legislation requiring greater safety management




REVENUE AND CUSTOMERS

- BCRY currently offers significant car storage capacity within its agricultural and industrial areas
- Car storage revenues 2015 = \$69,652
- Projected car storage revenues 2016 = \$700,000
- Cars stored are empty, purged, and secured to ensure safety of public and rail facilities
- Through private agreement, Cando and the Town of Collingwood have capitalized on car storage within the Collingwood owned rail line within Essa Township
- BCRY provides Barrie and Simcoe County businesses the ability to move equipment too large for truck transport on Ontario Highways
- Projected Paddison Outdoor Sign Revenue 2016 \$32,000
- Surplus rail sale and miscellaneous revenue
 - Projected 2016 \$500,000

REDUCED PROPERTY TAXES AND INCREASE IN PROVINCIAL FUNDING

- 2015 Tax Bills totaled \$7627.43
- MTO currently engaging shortlines to discuss feasible business models and potential for funding programs



WHY SUPPORT RAIL

- Canada's railways conserve fuel, limit emissions and relive highway congestion.
- One railcar on average moves the same amount of freight as 4 semi trucks.
- Reducing volumes of semi-trucks assists in the increase to road life cycles.
- Canada's transportation sector generates 28 per cent of our country's greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions however railway produce just 5 per cent of the total and 1 per cent of our country's overall GHG.
- Ontario trade gateways handle 65 per cent of Canada/US trade, including 80 per cent of Canada/US rail trade.
- A large percentage of BCRY's car movements are final point delivery on shipments for the United States
