BY-LAW NUMBER 2016 -

A By-law of the Corporation of the City of Barrie to authorize the execution of a Transfer Payment Agreement between The Corporation of the City of Barrie and the Province of Ontario for the purpose of the Public Transit Infrastructure Fund, a fund that is expected to accelerate investments to support the rehabilitation of transit systems and fund studies to support transit expansion plans.

WHEREAS the *Municipal Act, 2001* (Ontario), as amended, provides that a municipal power shall be exercised by by-law unless the municipality is specifically authorized to do otherwise;

AND WHEREAS the Federal Government has established the Public Transit Infrastructure Fund (PTIF) that proposes to invest \$3.4 billion in public transit over the next two years;

AND WHEREAS the funding is expected to accelerate investments to support the rehabilitation of transit systems and fund studies to support transit expansion plans;

AND WHEREAS the City of Barrie has been received pre-approval for their share of the funding which is estimated to be approximately \$4 million;

AND WHEREAS motion 16-G-019 provides staff with the authorization to submit applications for grants that would reduce expenditures associated with projects, programs and services approved as part of the operating and capital budgets;

AND WHEREAS motion 16-G-017 provided direction to staff to apply for federal infrastructure funding opportunities;

AND WHEREAS as part of the program the Federal Government will fund up to 50% of the eligible costs of the list of projects identified as Schedule "A" to this By-law and that all funds are to be expensed by March 31, 2018.

NOW THEREFORE The Council of the Corporation of the City of Barrie adopted motion 16-G-211 pre-approving the Conventional Bus Replacement capital projects identified in Schedule "A" as part of the Public Infrastructure Transit Fund;

- 1. **THAT** the City of Barrie enter into a Transfer Payment Agreement with the Province of Ontario to receive Public Transit Infrastructure funding; and
- 2. **THAT** the Mayor and City Clerk on behalf of The Corporation of the City of Barrie be authorized to execute the Transfer Payment Agreement; and
- 3. THAT this By-law shall come into force and effect immediately upon the passing thereof.

READ a first and second time this 3rd day of October, 2016.

READ a third time and finally passed this 3rd day of October, 2016.
