
Re: Municipal Heritage Register Policy, Potential Listings.

The Council of the Township of Oro-Medonte, at its Council meeting held on March 8, 2017 passed the following motion with respect to the above-noted matter:

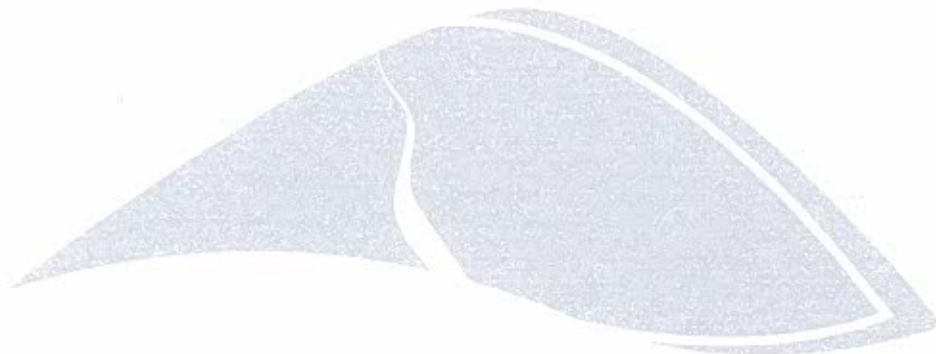

Thanks for your interest Scott. The first mentioned property is 190 Shanty Bay Rd. It is the last property located in the City of Barrie on the north side of Shanty Bay Rd. The old County Historic plaque is on the east side of it on the Penetanguishene Road allowance. Although it is in the City so is half the old survey of Kempenfelt Village. This is an opportunity to couple with the history folks in Barrie, same incentive. This survey is the very start of Simcoe County.

The second property is a vacant lot to the east of 291 Shanty Bay Rd. It is not vacant because it contains the old building I described. I have photos that I will search for and forward if I find them.

I used the LSRCA property owners mapping to view this area and determine their location.

Subject: Attention History Committee, Historic designations

I notice that the list of historic buildings doesn't include two sites in Old Kempenfelt Village, registered plan #1 in Simcoe County.

The most recognized is the former hotel/barracks on the north side of the Ridge Road just as you enter the Township.

The other is much less known. It is an old building that may have been used for a barn or storage building. It is located on the south side of Ridge Road west of Colbourn Street behind some trees. The owner has taken some care in keeping it in good repair but it shows the signs of early construction i.e..stone foundation, wide pine boards for siding on hand hewn frame work.
