


#### The North Shore Trail Access Improvements Project






- Capital improvement project approved in the
   2023 Business Plan for implementation in 2025
- Implementation of recommendations identified in the 2023 Waterfront Strategic Plan and the 2022 North Shore Tail Vegetation Management Plan
- Create new access points and connections to the North Shore Trail and the Kempenfelt shoreline
- Improve site drainage to reduce risk of pooling and flooding on the North Shore Trail











- Site drainage improvements






