#### MAKE AFFORDABLE HOUSING MORE ATTAINABLE TO END HOMELESSNESS

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Providing deep **Rent Subsidies** for individuals and families (\$600-\$800) distributed through Housing First and Outreach teams

### CREATING NEW SUPPORTIVE HOUSING PROGRAMS

Increase creative **Supportive Housing Programs** by converting existing community housing into supportive housing programs

#### CREATING PEACE OF MIND WHEN USING SERVICES

Offering **Storage Unit Solutions** for people who are homeless to store belongings safely while accessing services

Enhancing and mobilizing mobile **Outreach Services** to improve safety and well-being for all

#### INCREASING HOUSING AVAILABILITY IN CURRENT PROGRAMS

Increasing housing availability through increased **Affordable Housing** stock and **Supportive Housing** units, and lifting the funding freeze on the **Domiciliary Care Program** 



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#### CREATING EASIER WAYS TO HELP ACCESS SERVICES

Implementing a **Centralized Intake System** that is available after hours for services



Increasing funding to the **Shelter System** and supporting the **Temporary Shelter** at Rose Street over the winter months



Improving access to housing through Housing Retention Funding by doubling the grant limits for families



#### IMPROVING SHELTER ON THE HOUSING CONTINUUM

Addressing repairs/maintenance needs through the **Retrofits & Upgrades Program** (up to \$50K per grant)



#### FINDING NEW OPPORTUNITIES

Continued attention to **Potential Capital/Operating Opportunities** to increase housing

## Shelter Expansion / Encampment Response Initiative

One-time funding under HPP (2024-2025)



### MMAH Approved Funding Administration and Allocation

- The County produced a fast, flexible plan that included the addition of, or enhancements to:
  - Modular structures
  - Leased housing opportunities for shared living
  - Additional beds added to existing rapid rehousing programs
  - The provision of the Canada-Ontario Housing Benefit (COHB) to freeup shelter spaces
- Restoration Costs \$933,000
- Operating \$1,350,000 Soft Costs (Capital) \$150,000
- In alignment with ERI guidelines, funding was provided to Barrie, Orillia, Midland and Collingwood for restoration of parks and other public lands previously used as encampments



# Modular Rapid Rehousing

- Supported final construction and permitting process for two modulars placed at Blake Street
  - Modular One
    - Presently occupied Youth Haven
    - 21 funded spaces
  - Modular Two
    - Anticipated for Seniors Rapid-Rehousing Program or supportive housing component of HART Hub initiative.
- Enhanced the number of beds at a youth Rapid-Rehousing Program in Orillia





# Increased Warming Centres




- Barrie overnight warming centers
  - Tiffin Street
    - 20-person capacity
    - Operational January 13 April 30, 2025
  - Blake Street
    - 10-person capacity
    - Operational December 20, 3024 April 30, 2025
- Local Flexibility and Ownership.
  - Tiffin repurposed use of existing paramedic station
  - Blake utilized the showroom space of the building located at Blake.



### Enhancing Outflow: Canada-Ontario Housing Benefit (COHB)

- COHB was offered to persons in:
  - shelter
  - rapid rehousing
  - encampments
  - Persons at-risk of becoming homeless and using up shelter space
- This places rent supplements in the hands of shelter program participants so they can exit into permeant housing





# Ontario Health- Assisted Living



- 77 seniors within SCHC housing were provided with case management supports (housing and health), through LOFT.
- Funding created 30 subsidies for seniors experiencing homeless, to reside in supportive housing program at Simcoe Terrace.
- Supported seniors across our 7 domiciliary care residences across the County with a rent subsidy
- Subsidies were successful in moving some seniors from encampments, shelters, and rapid rehousing.







# What's Next

- Continued application of modular rapid-rehousing programs
- Implementation of new ten-year plans, including the Simcoe County Housing Corporation (SCHC) Affordable Housing Master Plan, which seeks to create 1000 additional county-owned affordable housing units across the County over the next 10-years
  - This includes the development at 20 Rose Street
- Implementation of HART Hub
- Assessment of Winter Response Strategy (Warming Centres) and Cooling Centres in Winter months.
- Enhanced accessibility to primary care initiatives
