Survey of Barrie Playing Fields Apparently Not In Current Use.

During the preparation of the report, we heard from minor sports associations that there were not enough playing fields, particularly for soccer and baseball, to accommodate the numbers of children desiring to play.

In order to assess the possibility that some unused fields might be available, we compiled lists of the fields currently in use. For soccer fields, we went to www.Barriesoccer.com which linked to:

This site showed all the scheduled minor-league soccer games and their locations. By going through all the schedules, we compiled the following list of soccer fields apparently in use:

Similarly, to compile the list of baseball diamonds currently in use, we went to www.barriebaseball.com/ where we found listed all the scheduled games for minor-league baseball. Note that this site offers a list of diamond locations, but three of those, Lampman Lane, MacMorrison and Queen's Parks, do not appear in any of the schedules. By going through all the schedules, we compiled the following list of baseball diamonds apparently in use:

Finally we went to that most useful City listing of all parks with their available features, shown at https://www.barrie.ca/community-recreation-environment/parks-trails-waterfront/parks. We went through the entire list of parks, and identified all the ones which had soccer fields, baseball diamonds, or both. These are listed in the table at the end of this paper.

For each park, the relevant airphoto was examined in the Simcoe County GIS, available at https://opengis.simcoe.ca/public/?THEME=Forestry%20and%20Recreation. This extremely valuable system let us look closely at each field. In the list, parks with available fields are identified with X. If the field had been identified as being in use in our compilation, then the identification was XY. If the field was not in our compiled list, then the identification was XN.

For fields not apparently in use, we measured the critical dimension. For soccer fields, this was the length of the field from goal to goal, as measured in the GIS. For baseball diamonds, this was the radius of the field, measured along the first and third base lines. These measurements are shown beside the N in the list.

From this survey, it appears possible that there are 7 unused soccer fields and 8 unused baseball diamonds, excluding Queen's Park. Highlighted in red are the names of parks with no scheduled games that we could find.

In addition, Cartwright Park currently has a small soccer field only 45 metres long, which is apparently not in use. However, there is enough unused space in that park to provide two soccer fields each 80x45 metres. We note that Cartwright Park is included in the Barrie 2024 Play Court Construction & Park Site Works Program. An update https://www.barrie.ca/planning-building-infrastructure/current-projects/municipal-infrastructure-projects/play-court-construction-park-site-works-program) dated 6 August, says that "the City will connect with Barrie residents to learn about the community's interests and needs for Cartwright Park related to the proposed full-sized play court feature". With luck, this program might provide one or two more available soccer fields.
