What We Heard

- 222 Community members engaged through interactive workshops
- 7 614 Online survey respondents
- 7 17 Stakeholder groups consulted over 3 rounds of engagement

Key Themes

"Green and accessible year round"

"There is an opportunity to revitalize Spirit Catcher Park."

"Keep doing what has been started - wheelchair accessible picnic tables, permanent shade umbrellas, etc."

"Greater access to the water and waterfront views with trails." "Alternative options to the car should be available to access the waterfront such as public transportation, shuttle buses, walking and biking."

"Parking solutions are needed to direct visitors to desirable areas."





Capital Improvements	Short Term (2024-2028)	Medium Term (2029-2033)	Long Term (2034+)
Plans, Studies and Strategy Creation	\$975K	\$790K	\$450K
Upgrades and Area Revitalization	\$16.1M	\$17.9M	\$26.8M
Strategic Physical Improvements	\$1.5M	\$3.8M	\$2.5M
Strategic Land Acquisition	\$2.6M	\$1.9M	-
Total	\$21M	\$24.3M	\$29.8M









The planning approach will allow for multiple Council touchpoints throughout via Park and Business Planning processes.

The Barrie Community, key stakeholders and local organizations were engaged at crucial stages of the process. The Strategy provides a framework for additional opportunities for community input throughout the implementation process.
