LICENSING FRAMEWORK FOR ADDITIONAL RESIDENTIAL UNITS (ARU)

That staff in the Development Services Department investigate how other municipalities have developed licensing framework and by-laws relating to Additional Residential Units (ARU) and report back to the Town and Gown Committee.

SECTION "C"

**GROVE STREET EAST AND JOHNSON STREET SIGNALIZATION
(WARD 1)**

1. That the intersection of Grove Street East and Johnson Street be fully signalized.
2. That a capital project be included in the 2026 Budget for the installation of traffic control signals in the amount of \$400,000.
3. That Traffic By-Law 2020-107, Schedule '19', "Providing for the Erection of Stop Signs at Intersections" be amended by removing the following:

Johnson Street and
Grove Street East

Eastbound, Westbound, Northbound
and Southbound on Johnson Street
and Grove Street East

This matter was recommended (Section "D") to General Committee for consideration of adoption at its meeting to be held on 8/13/2025.
