CANADIAN WATER AND WASTEWATER ASSOCIATION (CWA) INAUGURAL UTILITY EXCELLENCE AWARD AND THE METERING INTERNATIONAL EXCELLENCE AWARD

Jim Sales, General Manager of Community Operations presented Mayor Lehman, John Thompson, Director of Environmental Services and Sandra Brunet, Manager of Water Operations with the Canadian Water and Wastewater Association (CWA) Inaugural Utility Excellence Award and the Metering International Excellence Award. He noted that City staff made considerable efforts in completing the construction and the commissioning the Water Pollution Control Centre. Sandra Brunet, Manager of Water Operations thanked City Council for recognizing the efforts of staff noting it was a team effort. John Thompson, Director of Environmental Services expressed his appreciation to staff in all departments involved for their efforts.

Mayor Lehman congratulated staff on behalf of City Council for receiving the awards. He stated that the City takes great pride in the quality of water it provided to the community.

DEPUTATION(S) ON COMMITTEE REPORTS

Don MacNeil of the Council of Canadians (Barrie) Simcoe Region Chapter provided a deputation in opposition to motion 12-G-152 concerning Bottled Beverages at Special Events. He commented that he felt the debate at the General Committee concerning the motion focused too much on the word "ban" and not the intent of the matter. Mr. MacNeil stated that he believes the motion should be an addendum to the original item for discussion. He provided a number of examples where he feels bans have worked in society, including banning smoking in public areas. Mr. MacNeil expressed concern regarding the impact bottled water has on landfills and the environment. He noted that the Federation of Canadian Municipalities has adopted a resolution to encourage municipalities to phase out the sale of bottled water. He cited examples of various municipalities and universities in North America who have banned bottled water. He concluded by requesting that City Council reconsider the recommendation concerning Bottled Beverages at Special Events.

Andrew Bacque provided a deputation to City Council in opposition to motion 12-G-151 concerning Taxi Tariffs and Taxi Industry Consultation. He noted that Deluxe Taxi supports the recommendation to provide a discount for seniors and the reduction of taxi fares in general and would support a change that would address transaction fees. He commented that he appreciated the proactive approach taken by City Council concerning the taxi industry. Mr. Bacque indicated that he believes further enforcement is required to regulate the industry. Mr. Bacque suggested that the City of Barrie investigate other municipalities' policies and procedures to address taxi safety, fairness for the industry and other measures being taken to reduce the cost to the taxpayers. He asked that a clause be included in the motion to re-iterate Council's commitment to develop and enforce a comprehensive fair regulatory regime for the taxi's industry with a time deadline. He concluded by requesting that City Council improve enforcement for the taxi industry and provide a mechanism for the taxi industry to communicate formally/informally with City Council.

Henry Renkema provided a deputation in opposition to motion 12-G-151 concerning Taxi Tariffs and Taxi Industry Consultation. He stated that he agreed with the fare reduction and discount for seniors. He requested that City Council delay the reduction in fares until the fall as he feels the reduction may impact taxi drivers financially during the summer season. Mr. Renkema commented that he believes delaying the reduction in the fares will provide time for the taxi industry to adjust to the proposed seniors discount.

Members of City Council asked a number of questions concerning the information provided and received responses from City staff.

Bob Harrington provided a deputation in opposition to motion 12-G-151 concerning Taxi Tariffs and Taxi Industry Consultation. He commented that since April 30, 2012 the number of taxis in the City have grown and feels that the proposed rate reduction and seniors discount will not necessarily increase taxi ridership. Mr. Harrington indicated that he feels seniors would prefer better service from taxi drivers rather than a 10% discount. He suggested that if the discount is implemented, it be applied to cash transactions only. He expressed concern regarding the consultation process utilized in preparation of the staff report. He provided a number of additional questions that he believes should be asked of the taxi companies, taxi drivers and other municipalities in order to receive complete information regarding the industry. Mr. Harrington stated that he questioned a number of municipalities concerning best practices utilized to enforce the taxi industry and provided the responses. He concluded by requesting City Council to conduct a fulsome review of the industry before lowering the rates as proposed.

Erwin Giles, President of Barrie Taxi Ltd. and Vice President of the Canadian Taxi Association provided a deputation in opposition to motion 12-G-151 concerning Taxi Tariffs and Taxi Industry Consultation. He described the differences between a Taxicab Company - Brokerage, Taxicab Owner - Broker and Taxicab Driver. Mr. Giles indicated how many taxi companies, taxicabs and taxi drivers existed in 2002, 2006 and 2012 and the value of the licence fees associated with each of the categories. He discussed the increase in revenue the City has received generated from licence fees. Mr. Giles examined the costs involved with operating a taxicab in Barrie and noted that he believes lowering the rates and offering a seniors discount will have a significant impact on revenue. However it may generate more taxi rides. Mr. Giles suggested that the proposed discount for seniors only be applied to cash fares and that the fares be rounded up to the next \$.05 increment. He concluded by stating that he is willing to sit on a working group with the City and the taxi industry if the opportunity is available.

Joanna McEwen and Paul Marshall of an Oro-Medonte History Association Ad-Hoc Committee provided a presentation regarding the proposed Legacy Projects - War of 1812/1814. Mr. Marshall noted that Plan No. 1 registered in the Land Registry Office for Simcoe County is the Plan for the Village of Kempenfel(d)t registered in 1811. He displayed a copy of the Plan noting a number of the streets. Ms. McEwen noted that Plan No. 1 is the oldest subdivision in Simcoe County and provided historical information regarding the area. She described the legacy project and highlighted similar projects in other municipalities. Ms. McEwen explained that the proposed project includes the installation of street signage to identify the historic role of the Village of Kempenfel(d)t, Penetanguishene Road and Yonge Street. She requested that City Council consider the proposal and partner with the Township of Oro-Medonte and the County of Simcoe to implement the project.

City Council asked a number of questions regarding the information and received responses from the presenters.

12-A-092 **BARRIE FIRE AND EMERGENCY SERVICE'S 2011 ANNUAL REPORT**

Fire Chief John Lynn provided a presentation regarding the Barrie Fire and Emergency Service's 2011 Annual Report. Chief Lynn outlined the various branches of the Barrie Fire and Emergency Service and noted the three levels of defence utilized by the Fire Department. He compared the number of total incidents to the total number of apparatus response for the past five years. Chief Lynn provided the breakdown of the 2011 incidents by type. He highlighted the results of the five year average for the 6 minute road response and the 10 firefighters on the scene in 10 minutes response. Chief Lynn reviewed the communications revenue for the past five years. He related to the provision of dispatcher services to other municipalities and compared the City's operating costs with the comparator municipalities as provided by the Ontario Municipal Benchmarking Initiative's (OMBI) statistics.
