The International Relations Committee met and reports as follows:

SECTION "A"

COMMITTEE BUDGET UPDATE

Tammie Maynard, Legislative Coordinator provided an update concerning the Committee's budget.

HARROGATE, UNITED KINGDOM UPDATE

Mark Sachkiw, Co-Chair, provided an update concerning Harrogate, United Kingdom. He acknowledged the Barrie Chamber of Commerce on the official launch of the twin-city exchange with the Harrogate Business Improvement District (BID), and the positive opportunities this could provide connecting businesses between the two cities.

YOUTH AMBASSADORS/GLOBAL PERSPECTIVES PROGRAM

Shannon Scully-Pratt outlined the draft letter for Murayama, Japan advising them of the changes to the Youth Ambassador Program.

Jamie Babcock provided an update concerning the Global Perspectives Program. Mr. Babcock advised that students in the Global Perspectives Program will be traveling to Zweibrucken, Germany, between May and June, 2025.

The Committee approved an expenditure from the International Relations Committee budget in the amount of \$9,000.00 to cover costs associated with buses for the Global Perspectives Program.

SAGINAW, MICHIGAN UPDATE

Stephannie Schlichter, Director of Economic and Creative Development, provided an update concerning the Saginaw Sister City Conference scheduled for fall, 2025. Ms. Schlichter indicated that the City does have some US travel restrictions at this time. The Committee discussed the current climate with the US, and the potential impact on the City's new sister city relationship with Saginaw, Michigan. The Committee provided feedback to Ms. Schlichter concerning the Saginaw Sister City Conference and received responses.
