- Common presenting needs included housing assistance, necessities like food bank access, and healthcare supports







Supporting Ontario's Public Libraries to Empower Local Economic Growth and Student Success

Ontario Library Association & Federation of Ontario Public Libraries 2024-25 Pre-Budget Submission

Public and school libraries are the foundation for success for millions of Ontarians in communities of all sizes.

As part of the 2024-25 Pre-Budget consultation process, the Ontario Library Association (OLA) and the Federation of Ontario Public Libraries (FOPL) are bringing forward priority recommendations on behalf of both Ontario's public and school libraries. These will empower entrepreneurship and small businesses, newcomer integration and support from vulnerable communities, as well as give students the skills they need to succeed in every community across the province.

Priorities Overview

Public Libraries

- Provide critical e-learning support and fair access to modern, digital resources for all Ontario
 public libraries through the creation of an Ontario Digital Public Library, leveraging the
 province's significant purchasing power to give all Ontarians access to a universal set of highquality e-learning & online resources through their local public library.
- Working alongside First Nations Public Library leaders, implement a sustainable funding model
 for public libraries on reserve to ensure that these important local hubs are fully-funded and
 viable. As an immediate first step, enhance the existing direct provincial funding support for
 public libraries on reserve (the First Nations Salary Supplement) to sustainably fund library
 operations and ensure a living income for frontline library staff in these communities.
- Increase provincial operating funding for Ontario's public libraries to address critical shared priorities and community needs.

2024 Barrie City Council Requests



▶ Request: Explore County of Simcoe funding for Community Navigator position

Result: 9-month pilot project funded in 2024 by County of Simcoe; funding continued through 2025

► Request: Develop key performance indicators and report back to City Council

Result: Key Performance Indicators developed and presented to Council on October 9 with approval

► Request: Participate in a Value for Money audit conducted by the City of Barrie Internal Audit

Result: Audit was performed in Q3/Q4 with a final report presented in December noting positive results. Minor policy revisions were requested and are under review

Financial Controls and Oversight Policy



Request: Create a Financial Controls and Oversight Policy

Actions:

- ► The Library Board approved a new Financial Controls and Oversight Policy on November 28, 2024.
- ► The Policy aims to modify the Library's reserves, including the creation of a new reserve and a name change for an existing reserve.
- ► The new reserve would provide financial stability to help with increasing vendor costs and unforeseen expenses
- Spending from reserves must always be approved by the Library Board

Planning for the Future



- ► Continue data-driven decision making around collections, programming, and services to ensure efficient and effective operations
- ► New 2025-2029 Strategic Plan to guide directions and priorities, while aligning with City of Barrie strategic plan
- ► Continue to work with City of Barrie on plans for shared library and recreation centre spaces in the south end
- Opportunity for a northwest Barrie community library
