Executive Summary:

The purpose of this report is to recommend names to be added to the Municipal Names Registry list that will be used to facilitate the naming of streets, parks and other municipal assets in future developments within the City.

Key Findings:

Maintaining the Municipal Names Registry, with names approved by Council, facilitates the process for assigning names to streets and municipal assets. Ensuring there are appropriate names available to be used for streets and municipal assets allows the City to effectively foster growth while contributing to a sense of place. Street names are a key component for the addressing process intended to provide a unique municipal identifier for the properties in the City and to provide municipal services to its residents.

Financial Implications:

There are no financial implications for the Corporation resulting from the proposed recommendation.

Alternatives:

The following alternatives are available for consideration by General Committee:

Alternative #1 – General Committee could reject the recommended motion and request that Planning staff provide a new or revised list of names for the naming of Municipal Assets in future developments.

This alternative is not recommended. The proposed names are consistent with the Council approved Municipal Naming Policy and have been vetted and approved by Emergency Services and surrounding municipalities.

Additional Background Information and Analysis:

The Municipal Naming Policy, updated in January 2016, establishes the processes and criteria for naming, renaming and dedicating Municipal Assets such as streets, parks and facilities as well as including the methods by which the public may provide suggestions and comments.

The Municipal Names Registry is a central repository of all approved names for streets, parks and other municipal assets. The registry includes qualifying names as suggested by the public and commemorative names.

The application forms associated with the proposed names to be added to the Municipal Names Registry can be found in Appendix B - Application Forms.

Consultation and Engagement:

All proposed names to be added to the Municipal Names Registry, as provided for in Appendix A to Staff Report DEV005-25 were circulated to appropriate City departments and external stakeholders, including neighbouring municipalities. No concerns have been raised regarding the proposed names.

The proposed names have met the following naming principles, which are from the Council approved Municipal Naming Policy:

- a) Names shall be unique; name duplication and similar sounding or spelled names shall be avoided.
- b) The names give a sense of place, continuity and belonging, and celebrate the distinguishing characteristics and uniqueness of Barrie.
- c) The names maintain a long-standing local area identification with the residents of Barrie.
- d) The names promote pride in the City of Barrie and acknowledge local heritage, history, and unique features.
- e) Names may, on an exceptional basis, honour the significant contribution of an individual or family.

<p>My father John Alan Hopper was the CEO of the Barrie YMCA from 1965-his retirement in 1987. During this time not only did he make the Y a central part of the community, he was also known as the volunteer of volunteers! He was instrumental in bringing Big Brothers to Barrie. He served with the United Way and Central United Church. He helped establish the Barrie youth Hostel in the late 1960s and worked with the Barrie Recreation Committee. He was President of the Barrie Rotary Club during the Tornado and served to be instrumental in helping fund raise for the clean up after the disaster. He also played a role in the beginning of the Barrie Fun Run in May. My father was recognized twice as citizen of the year. He was also honoured by the Y by having the gymnasium named after him. Unfortunately the Y has been demolished as has the Central United Church where my dad volunteered his time as well. My dad's legacy is dying in this city and I think that he needs to be remembered. My dad lived his life as a volunteer in the City of Barrie, I would love him to be immortalized by naming a street after him.</p> <p>I am sure this is just a brief amount of my dad's contributions to this city as I was too young to remember everything that he did. Volunteer of volunteers hailed for contributions

Al Hopper, who one associate says "lived his life as a volunteer," died suddenly Thursday while on vacation in Vancouver.

He was 62.

Hopper spent 22 years as executive director at the Barrie YMCA before he retired on his 60th birthday in 1987. He was a past president of the Rotary Club of Barrie and was twice honored as Barrie's citizen of the year, most recently in 1987. He also co-founded the Big Brothers chapter in Barrie.

YMCA book-keeper Sandra Oakley worked with Hopper for 16 years, and said today he will be remembered for his years of volunteer work with the Y and the city.

"He was a leader in the community," Oakley said. "He was known by so many people and respected by so many people. He believed in being a volunteer, and lived his life as a volunteer."

was instrumental in a major expansion at the YMCA in the mid-70's, and emphasized the facility's family atmosphere. He also served on the national board of directors.

He served with Big Brothers, the United Way, the Central United Church. He helped establish the Barrie Youth Hostel in the late 1960s, and worked with the Barrie recreation committee.

Freig Stewart, recreation co-ordinator for the Ministry of Tourism Recreation's Barrie office, said Hopper was like a father to him.

"He was the first person I met when I moved up here eight years ago and he sort of took me under his wing," he said. "He was respected right across Canada by the YMCA as one of their best."

Stewart said Hopper "epitomized the small town guy that was the backbone of the organization in the fifties and sixties."

Al Hopper dies in B.C.

FORMER YMCA executive director and well-known community figure Al Hopper died suddenly this week at the age of 61.

Hopper died of a massive heart attack Thursday afternoon while he and his wife Jean were visiting relatives in Victoria, B.C. The couple was expected to fly back to Toronto that day but Hopper died in an ambulance on the way to hospital, said close friend and 'Y' bookkeeper, Sandra Oakley.

She expressed shock at Hopper's death, Friday, saying she just got a postcard from the couple saying they were having a wonderful time. "It sounds like it was very sudden and very unexplained because he's never had a heart problem."

The funeral is expected to be held tomorrow at Central United Church and arrangements are being handled by the Steckley-Gooderham Funeral Home, 30 Worsely Street, in Barrie.

Hopper retired in 1987 as executive director of the Barrie YMCA after 22 years and has been named Citizen of the year twice, by the Royal Canadian Legion.

"He's just so well known and so well liked, because he's just done so much for Barrie," said Oakley.

Ed Giles, the man who replaced Hopper as executive director, said Friday, "He is certainly going to be missed in the YMCA circle. He has certainly given a lot to the YMCA."

Hopper was instrumental in making major improvements to the Grove Street facility, including the building of a gymnasium and game courts in the mid 1970s that more than doubled the size of the building.
