## About us: History



- Registered charity, formerly called Environmental Action Barrie (EAB)
- Living Green Barrie (EAB) has existed for almost 30 years
- Has created and participated in a variety of innovative environmental services and programs that have since taken on a life of their own:
  - Be Green Barrie- installed 10,000 low flow toilets, taps, showerheads
  - Recycling Depot first to recycle plastics
  - Store selling green cleaning products in refillable containers
  - Off the Rack, Barrie Free Clothing Centre & Reskill Institute
  - Community Gardens
  - Spring into Clean



• Currently we are run by 2 part-time staff members guided by a 6-member Board of Directors



- We have 3 main project activities:
  - 1. GreenScreen
  - 2. FruitShare
  - 3. Community Tree Plantings

- GreenScreen -Acting as a source of environmental information and creating a local green community
- We also are very active on Social Media and put out quarterly newsletters to build our green community





- FruitShare
- Working closely with Urban Pantry and other social organizations we have installed Food Forests at Shear, Leacock and Sunnidale Park's
- Barrie Native Friendship Centre
- Barrie Community housing
- Various schools



## Climate Change Adaptation Strategy Implementation Plan, 2018

- ACTION 3.2 Increase natural/forested areas within sub-watersheds with high surcharge and flooding.
- ACTION 5.2 Develop incentives, standards, and permitting processes to enhance green space, green roofs, and tree canopy on private and public properties.
- ACTION 5.3 Develop an Urban Forest Management Plan with specific greening strategies for areas of the City where tree canopy/ greenspace is low.








 ACTION 7.4 Encourage natural and constructed shade, cooling structures and spaces (e.g. recreational/sprinkler community water parks) on public and private property.






#### Why the urban heat island effect occurs




• ACTION 7.6 Create naturalized and edible landscapes on City land using existing resources.

## Missing from CCAS – growing mature trees



...Correct species for site, quality of stock, size of tree, Bare-root vs potted vs ball & burlap, Drought, Girdling, Rodent Guards, Pest management, Mulching, Fertilizer, Watering, Staking, Pruning, Soil type, Soil volume, compaction, contaminated soils, damage from string trimmers, roadsalt, etc. etc. etc....

Focus has to be on ROOTS, maintenance and growing mature trees

## Public Land Community Tree Planting Events



- Hold 3 4 spring & fall events
- 1,500 2,000 trees/year
- Popular, family friendly and allows people to feel that they "are doing something to fight Climate Change"
- "Easy" to fund
- Require large tracts of EP lands with safe, good access.

- -large number of trees planted in a single day
- -excellent media interest and vehicle to raise awareness

-----

- \$ -no direct cost to city
- Trees funded through external grants (LSRCA, TDFEF, etc.)

# Public Land Neighbourhood Tree Stewards



- 10 Small (10-60 trees) planting events /year
- Located on small "unused pockets" of public lands throughout the city across different wards
- Neighboring households are invited out by their councilors
- Neighbors plant the trees and are given the educational tools to become the stewards of these trees.
- Stewards take on the ongoing care of these trees (especially in the first few years when they need it most)

- trees have better chance to flourish if they are given follow up care
- cost of post planting maintenance to the City decreased (watering, weed control, etc.)
- Builds healthy, connected neighborhoods

-----

- \$ City pays for a percentage of administration
- external grants and fundraising

# Private Land Backyard Tree Planting



- Based on LEAF model; offer homeowners subsidized native trees and arborist help for planting quality trees in their yards.
- Participants receive follow up notification periodically about how to care for the trees (e.g. watering, mulching, pests, etc.)
- Targeted campaigns to neighborhoods with lower % of tree canopy

- financial incentive for more trees to be planted across city (focus on household cooling)
- trees purchased through conventional methods (retail) often don't result in quality, mature trees (wrong tree for site)

\$ -Cost share model:

1/3 Homeowner

1/3 LG (through fundraising activities)

1/3 City

# Private Land Corporate Greening and Health



- Target key ICI sectors Industrial/Commercial/Institutional that have plant-able lands
- Offer a Health & Wellness Program for the employees that focusses on getting them out into nature (for health)
- Provide a corporate tree planting event on their properties with the employees
- Maintenance and incentive to retain treed areas?

- Barrie has a large % of plant-able ICI lands
- Employees become educated about the health benefits of being around trees.
- Healthier staff = lower absentee rates and employee happiness (retention)

- Identify potential grants
- Endorsement or recommendation to council from BATSC
- Staff support
- Development of funding model including ongoing maintenance
- Continuing fundraising campaign
- Roll out in 2020
