SIR ROBERT BARRIE STATUE UPDATE

Councillor Ward advised the committee that the Heritage Barrie motion regarding the Sir Robert Barrie Statue was approved at City Council on June 2, 2014. He noted that the motion had been amended to direct the Department of Culture to investigate the cost related to sponsoring two commemorative busts or full size statues of Sir Robert Barrie to be displayed in a public viewing location and report back to General Committee. He advised that this item will be considered as part of the 2015 Business Plan.

HERITAGE REGISTER REVIEW

Councillor Ward advised that the Heritage Barrie motion to add 126 Burton Avenue to the Heritage Registry was approved at City Council on June 2, 2014. He noted that this was this is the first home in Barrie to be listed on the Heritage Registry.
