ITM 8.1 QUICK START FOR AFFORDABLE HOUSING PROJECTS ON INSTITUTIONAL LANDS

- 1. That the Development Services Department, supported by the Affordable Housing Task Force, write to all owners of institutionally designated properties in Barrie indicating the intention to allow housing as-of-right on their properties, and inviting them to contact the City to discuss the potential for the construction of affordable housing on their properties.
- 2. That once projects are determined, staff in the Development Services Department seek proposals from consultants in accordance with the Procurement By-law to conduct feasibility studies for affordable housing projects on institutionally designated properties owned by non-profit or charitable organizations to be funded by the Community Benefit Reserve for a total of up to 10 studies at a cost of up to \$20,000 each. ITM 8.2 REDWOOD PARK COMMUNITIES GRANT APPLICATIONS TO THE CANADA MORTGAGE AND HOUSING CORPORATION

WHEREAS there is a significant need in the City of Barrie to provide additional supportive and social housing for people facing and experiencing homelessness; and

WHEREAS Redwood Park Communities has a strong track record of involvement with social housing in the City of Barrie; and

WHEREAS Redwood Park Communities has applied for grant funding for two housing projects in the City of Barrie from the Canadian Mortgage and Housing Corporation; and

WHEREAS the Barrie City Council adopted motion 21-G-188 to provide an interest free loan up to \$3,000,000 with conditions, including the loan being subject to approval of application for grant funding by the Canadian Mortgage and Housing Corporation, for the two housing projects that Redwood Park Communities intends to commence in Barrie.

NOW THERFORE BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

- 1. That the City of Barrie strongly urges Canadian Mortgage and Housing Corporation to approve the grant applications submitted by Redwood Park Communities to provide funding for both their projects in the City of Barrie at the earliest opportunity.
- 2. That a copy of this resolution be forwarded to Canadian Mortgage and Housing Corporation, the County of Simcoe, Doug Shipley MP, John Brassard MP, Ahmed Hussen MP, Adam Vaughan MP, Andrea Khanjin MPP, and Doug Downey MPP. (Item for Discussion 8.2, August 9, 2021)

ITM 8.7 OVERCOME THE EFFECTS OF COLONIZATION, DISCRIMINATION, AND RACISM ON INDIGENOUS COMMUNITIES IN CANADA

WHEREAS in recognition of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Calls to Action which stated that there is a need for all levels of government to work together with First Nations to overcome the effects of colonization, discrimination, and racism on Indigenous communities in Canada;

NOW THEREFORE IT BE RESOLVED as follows:

- 1. That the City of Barrie dedicate 0.2 percent of its 2022 water and wastewater revenue toward efforts to improve water services in Indigenous communities in a method to be determined at a future date.
- 2. That the representatives of Water First, a non-governmental organization (NGO), be invited to provide a presentation to the Finance and Corporate Services Committee. (Item for Discussion 8.7, August 9, 2021)

ITM 8.8 REQUIREMENT FOR HURRICANE STRIPS ON NEW BUILDS

WHEREAS on July 15, 2021, portions of the south-east quadrant of the City of Barrie were devastated by a tornado that caused substantial damage to public and private infrastructure, including homes, businesses and vehicles and previous tornadoes in the City of Barrie as well as across the province also warn of vulnerability to loss and damage from severe winds hazards; and

WHEREAS research conducted at the University of Western Ontario, the Institute for Catastrophic Loss Reduction and elsewhere find that 95 percent of the tornadoes in Ontario are magnitude 0-2 and the risk of loss and damage from these tornadoes can largely be prevented through identified and inexpensive changes in current home construction practices; and

WHEREAS government builders, insurance companies, researchers and others must work together to strengthen standards for building codes and construction practices to mitigate the expected damage from climate extremes, severe storms and natural disasters; and

WHEREAS a report by the National Institute of Buildings found that every \$1 spent on mitigation projects including tornado resilience measures in homes, reduces future costs by an average of \$6.00.

NOW THEREFORE IT BE RESOLVED as follows:

- 1. That staff in the Development Services, Legal Services and Building Services Departments partner with the Institute for Catastrophic Loss Reduction to:
 - a) Propose to the Ontario Government specific measures to modernize the Ontario Building Code with respect to severe wind protection for new homes, including the requirement for the use of straps, clips or other mechanisms to better connect the roof, wall and foundation of homes; and
 - b) Work in collaboration with other agencies to develop an awareness campaign to inform Barrie residents about the risk of destructive tornadoes, options to assess risk of damage to their home and identify risk reduction and best practices.

and report back to General Committee.

2. That in order to encourage installation of approved severe wind resilience features, staff in the Finance and Legal Services Departments investigate the feasibility of introducing a Rebate Program for homeowners that did not experience damage resulting from tornado damage on July 15, 2021 and financial incentives for those whose homes were damaged, and report back to General Committee. (Item for Discussion 8.8, August 9, 2021)
