The Y is a registered charity that has been serving Barrie and the surrounding area for over 100 years. As the largest provider of human services across Simcoe, Muskoka and Parry Sound, the Y is committed to building healthy communities by delivering programs that inspire people to reach their full potential. Current programs and services being delivered by the YMCA of Simcoe/Muskoka include:

- Camps, Outdoor Education and Leadership Development Programming for Children, Youth, and Families
- Employment Programs and Services
- English as a Second Language Instruction and Settlement Supports for Immigrants and Refugees
- Health, Fitness, and Aquatics Opportunities
- Licensed Child Care and Before/After School Care
- Literacy and Basic Skills for Adults
- Youth Outreach and Counselling Services

- 1. No licensed child care centres in urban growth node
- 2. Heart disease and cancer rates higher than provincial average
- 3. Youth mental health lower than provincial average
- 4. Youth homelessness is disproportionately high
- 5. Members of our community have a lower sense of belonging than others across Ontario

- Day camps and licensed child care to support working families
- Fitness options to connect people to a healthy lifestyle
- Swimming lessons to promote water safety
- Youth employment and counselling supports







Maximize the Impact of Community Partners:

- RVH– Cancer and Cardiac Rehabilitation Programs
- Youth Haven Youth Transitional Housing
- Opportunities for partnerships with Barrie Public Library, MacLaren Art Centre, Shak's World, Season's Centre for Grieving Children, the Barrie Native Centre, Georgian College, the City of Barrie, and others

- Support the City's vision to build a downtown that is safe, vibrant, and welcoming for all
- Create employment opportunities
- Increased foot traffic for local business
- Provide amenities needed to support downtown intensification





First Floor:

Second Floor:

Wellness Floor (strength and cardio equipment) Health Services Space (RVH) Public Meeting Rooms Fitness Studios

Third Floor: Indoor Track Walkout to outdoor fitness space



Parking – 130 spaces (20 surface level, 110 underground) Transitional Housing (Youth Haven) – Access from McDonald Street
