I, ALEX NUTTALL, Mayor of the City of BARRIE,

do hereby proclaim

November 17, 2022

as

Pancreatic Cancer Day

WHEREAS; In 2022, an estimated 6,700 people will be diagnosed with pancreatic cancer in Canada

and 90 percent will eventually die from the disease; and

WHEREAS; Pancreatic cancer has the lowest survival rate of all major cancers, and just 10 percent

of those diagnosed survive five years or longer; and

WHEREAS; Pancreatic cancer is the now the third leading cause of cancer related death in Canada;

and

WHEREAS; It is estimated that by 2025, 550,000 new cases will be diagnosed globally; and

WHEREAS; The good health and well-being of the residents of Barrie are enhanced as a direct result

of increased awareness about the risks and symptoms of pancreatic cancer, and

research into early detection, causes, and effective treatments.

THEREFORE, I, Alex Nuttall, Mayor of the City of Barrie, do hereby proclaim November 17, 2022 as

"Pancreatic Cancer Day" in the City of Barrie.
