RE: 2023 RECREATION AND SPORT COMMUNITY GRANT AWARDS

The purpose of this Memorandum is to provide an update to members of Council concerning the awarding of grant funding for the 2023 Recreation and Sport Community Grant Program as funded from the Reinvestment Reserve with an upward limit of \$300,000 approved by Council Motion 22-G-022.

The window for applications spanned March 13th to March 31st, 2023. In total, 21 applications for funding valued at just over \$600,000 were received with 8 requesting capital funding of \$345,000 and 13 for program/event funding of \$270,000. All applications were vetted for eligibility based on the criteria outlined in the Community Grant Guidelines document which was made available to all applicants. As a result of this review against eligibility criteria, six applications were deemed ineligible.

The adjudication panel was comprised of the following members:

- Dan Bell, Director of Recreation and Culture Services
- Kevin Bradley, Manager of Parks Planning
- Dawn McAlpine, General Manager of Community and Corporate Services
- Stephannie Schlichter, Director of Economic and Creative Development
- Kathleen Trainor, Executive Director of Tourism Barrie

All panel members independently evaluated each application using a scoring matrix containing questions rated on a scale of 1-5 (1 being poor and 5 being excellent). The questions were designed to reflect each application's quality of responses against four weighted criteria:

- 40% Community Participation and Overall Impact
- 25% Community Collaboration and Engagement
- 20% Alignment with the City's Strategic Priorities
- 15% Health and Well-Being of Residents

The adjudicators' responses were averaged to determine a ranking of applications from highest to lowest. Panel members then met as a group to discuss each application starting with the highest scoring submission and, upon consensus, determined the amount of funding to allocate each applicant.

The table below details the results of the adjudication panel's work. Fifteen grant applicants will receive over \$118,000 of the \$300,000 funding for 2023. These applications represent a wide cross-section of recreational and sport activities designed to engage Barrie residents in various ways with the end result of improving overall health and well-being.
