#### **CREATING NEW SUPPORTIVE HOUSING PROGRAMS**

Increase creative **Supportive Housing Programs** by converting existing community Housing into supportive housing programs

- Rose Street Temporary Supportive Housing Project:
  - > Intensive case management and wrap around community services
  - Post-housing support
- SCHC Housing Units converted to include increased wrap-around services to individuals selected from By Name List into housing



#### **CREATING PEACE OF MIND WHEN USING SERVICES**

Offering **Storage Unit Solutions** for people who are homeless to store belongings safely while accessing services

- Pilot staffed storage unit program at Rose Street Temporary Housing Program
- Assess community storage program for other potential areas of County





## IMPROVING SAFETY AND WELL-BEING FOR THE COMMUNITY AS A WHOLE

Enhancing and mobilizing mobile **Outreach Services** to improve safety and well-being for all

- Expand and mobilize year round Outreach Services in Barrie, Orillia and Midland serving county wide
- Engaging people to connect to services in the system
- Pilot program in Barrie built on safety and well being through strengthened relationships with individuals, business owners and community



## INCREASING HOUSING AVAILABILITY IN CURRENT PROGRAMS

Building up housing availability through increased **Affordable Housing** stock and **Supportive Housing** units, and lifting the funding freeze on the **Domiciliary Care** Program

- Allocating available resources to development of supportive housing
- Maximizing available housing resources available in the Domiciliary Program





### **CREATING EASIER WAYS TO HELP ACCESS SERVICES**

Implementing a **Centralized Intake System** that is available after hours for services



 A centralized intake system ensures timely access to emergency shelters and other homelessness supports and services

## ENHANCING OUR COMMUNITY SHELTERS SERVICES AND STANDARDS

Increasing funding to the **Shelter System** and supporting the **Temporary Shelter** at Rose Street over the winter months

- Stabilizing the shelter system to address:
  - Operations
  - ► Labour issues; recruitment and retention
  - > Standardized, quality program delivery
  - Year-round day and overnight services
  - Quality data collection
- Resume temporary shelter winter 2023-24





#### **INCREASING EVICTION PREVENTION SERVICES**

#### AND ACCESS TO HOUSING FOR FAMILIES

Improving and building up access to housing through **Housing Retention Funding** by doubling the grant limits for families

- Reduce in-flow to homelessness by supporting families and individuals to retain housing
  - Rent and mortgage arrears, utility arrears, first and last rent
  - Increased flexibility



#### IMPROVING SHELTER ON THE HOUSING CONTINUUM

Addressing repairs/maintenance needs through the **Retrofits & Upgrades Program** (up to \$50K per grant)

- Addressing retention of current housing supports on the continuum:
  - > Shelter system
  - Transitional housing
  - Supportive housing
  - Domiciliary programs
