#### 23-A-138 CLEAN-UP LAKE SIMCOE

Moved by: Councillor, A.M. Kungl Seconded by: Councillor, C. Riepma

WHEREAS in 2009 the Government of Ontario released its Lake Simcoe Protection Plan, which called for Lake Simcoe's phosphorus pollution to be reduced by 50% to 44 tonnes per year to protect our cold-water fishery and to prevent excessive weed growth and algae blooms; and

WHEREAS, the government of Ontario has still not funded or implemented a plan to reduce Lake Simcoe's phosphorus pollution to 44 tonnes per year; and

WHEREAS Lake Simcoe's phosphorus pollution has risen by 26% between 2015 and 2020 relative to its 2009 level;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

- 1. THAT The Corporation of the City of Barrie requests the Government of Ontario to fund and implement a plan to reduce Lake Simcoe's phosphorus pollution to 44 tonnes per year with a target date of 2030.
- 2. THAT a copy of this resolution be sent to local MPs and MPPs, Minister of the Environment, Conservation and Parks; and all Lake Simcoe watershed MPPs and municipalities.

#### AMENDMENT #1

That the Direct Motion concerning Clean-Up Lake Simcoe be amended by:

1. Deleting the following paragraph:

"Whereas the government of Ontario has still not funded or implemented a plan to reduce Lake Simcoe's phosphorus pollution to 44 tones per year".

2. Amend paragraph 1 to delete the words "fund and".

#### **AMENDMENT TO AMENDMENT #1**

Moved by: Deputy Mayor, R. Thomson Seconded by: Councillor, B. Hamilton

That the Direct Motion concerning Clean-Up Lake Simcoe be amended by keeping the first whereas and deleting the remainder of the motion and replacing it with the following:

"WHEREAS in 2009 the Government of Ontario released its Lake Simcoe Protection Plan, which called for Lake Simcoe's phosphorus pollution to be reduced by 50% to 44 tonnes per year to protect our cold-water fishery and to prevent excessive weed growth and algae blooms; and

WHEREAS the Federal Government originally committed funding for a Lake Simcoe Cleanup Fund, with a first round of funding 2007-2012, and the second round of funding for 2012-2017 being cancelled;

WHEREAS the Federal Government in the 2022 Federal Budget committed \$19.6 million for a Freshwater Action Fund, including Lake Simcoe but is yet to provide funding or parameters for a Lake Simcoe Clean-Up Fund; and

WHEREAS the Provincial Government has spent approximately \$13 million on Lake Simcoe environmental related activities (e.g. monitoring water quality); and

WHEREAS the Provincial Government initiated in 2022 a \$24 million investment over three years to build a Lake Simcoe phosphorus reduction project to help reduce phosphorus discharges from the Holland Marsh into Lake Simcoe;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

- 1. That a letter of support for the phosphorus reduction project be sent to the Minister of Environment, Conservation and Parks for the Province of Ontario with a request for a proposed timeline for implementation of the Plan.
- 2. That correspondence be sent to the Minister of Environment and Climate Change for the Federal Government requesting a funding envelope and parameters for the Lake Simcoe Clean-Up fund.
- 3. That the Mayor and CAO be directed to request a meeting with both the Federal and Provincial Ministers of Environment to discuss phosphorus reduction initiatives."
