The site of the proposed stadium is enjoyed all day, 365 days/year and is the only part of the whole path that is a wooded area. The treed canopy gives a natural habitat to birds and animals, as well as protection to humans in the winter wind, and hot summer sun. To take that away for a huge man-made structure is poor planning. Nature cannot be replaced. It is a unique and pristine asset to Barrie.

Stadium users do not need precious lakeside land. It is not the only piece of property that could be used for this purpose.

Other cities like Kingston, Orillia and Collingwood have been developing their waterfront trails so they are protecting the natural environment for all to enjoy. Let's do the same, keeping this natural area for use by the majority of citizens year round, rather than for a seasonal stadium.
