The BTSC has engaged Isaac Sports Group (ISG) to assist in a comprehensive study and business analysis towards a proposed 50m pool/aquatic facility. It is our intent to present this study to influence the development of the proposed Hewitt's recreation centre to include a 50m aquatic tank. As a vibrant waterfront community, our team feels this would enhance Barrie's appeal and sport tourism for visitors, provide increased aquatic programming and services to meet the demand of Barrie residents, and establish Barrie as a center for aquatic excellence. This initiative links directly to the City of Barrie strategic plan to build Barrie, engage our community, and create a 50m aquatic facility as a public space without rival in our region.

Is funding needed or already acquired? Please describe:

The BTSC has independently funded and contracted services from ISG, however, funding for the larger project has yet to be acquired. Based on information provided to the BTSC from Mayor Lehman and City of Barrie (COB) staff, there are plans for a new recreation centre (date TBD) in the Hewitt's area, with adequate land to accommodate a 50m facility. Per COB staff, current planning has provided for a 10 lane, 25m competition pool within this proposed centre.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

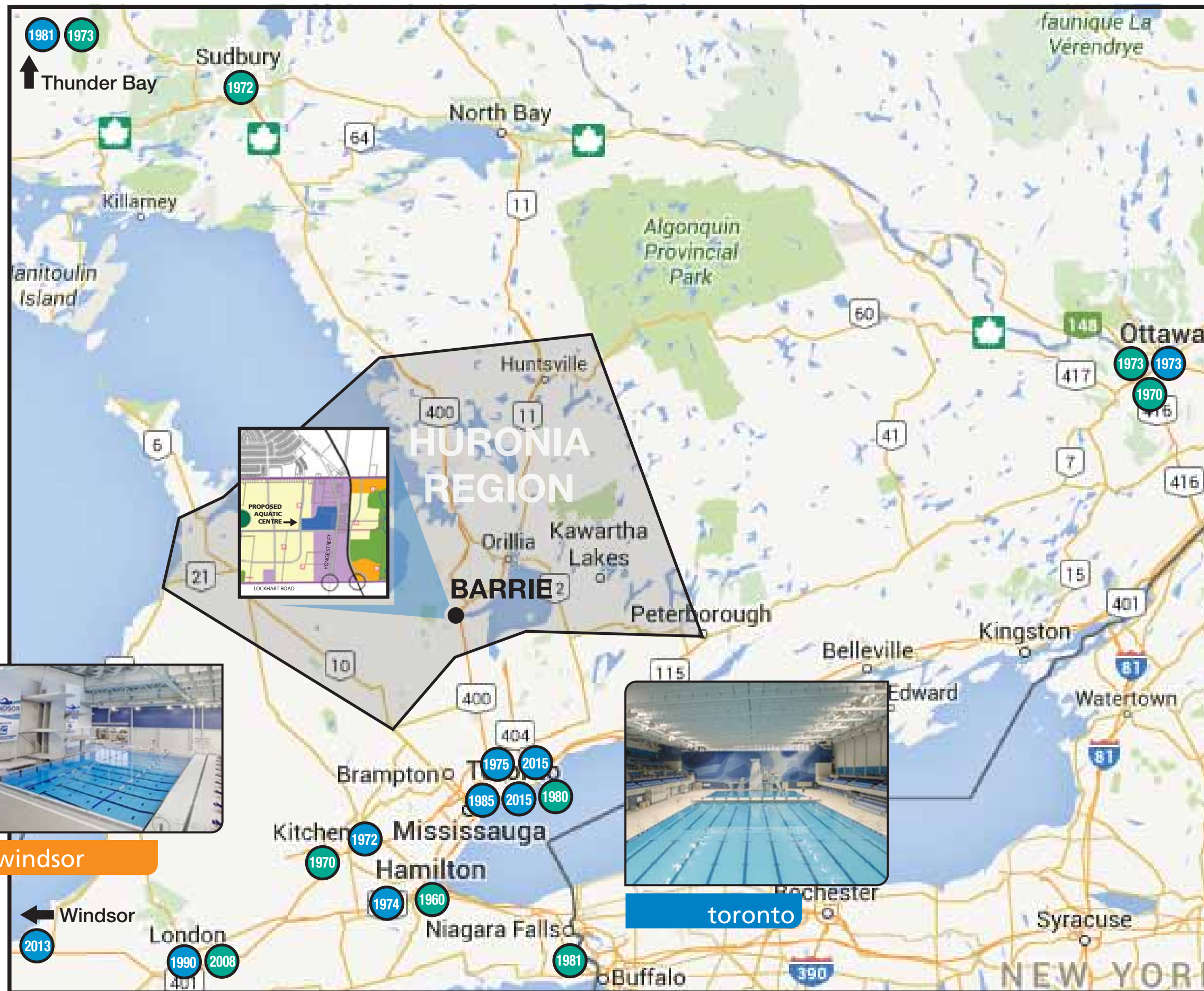
- Integrate a 50M aquatic centre into the next Recreation Centre
 - AFC study (2007) suggested that Ontario's weakness is in providing opportunities for sport training and event hosting as therapeutic uses, which requires deep water pools with lengths over 50m
- Increased sport tourism
 - Water Polo, diving and synchronized swimming are specialized competitive activities that remain popular among aquatic sports and are not offered in Barrie
- Enhance Barrie as a place people want to live
 - The most successful indoor aquatic centres normally include a variety of features that are designed to accommodate all ages and abilities with increasing emphasis on the need for aging population

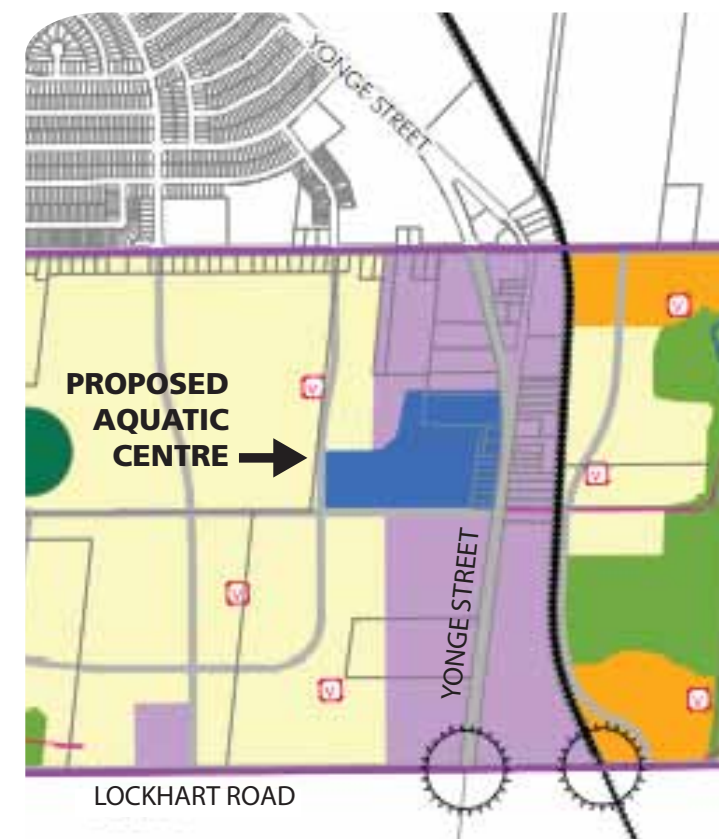
