



Demand for housing units.





County of Simcoe, as Consolidated Municipal Service Manager:

Administers and is accountable for federal, provincial and municipal investments in ending homelessness in Simcoe County.

All funding is fully allocated to more than 30 agencies, funding various types of programs and supports across the housing and homelessness services continuum including:

- outreach,
- emergency shelter,
- motel voucher,
- transitional housing,
- domiciliary care,
- housing support programs Regional Housing First & Rapid Re-Housing- both with housing subsidies,
- housing resource/housing access,
- peer mentor,
- adult and youth trustee,
- Indigenous and LGBTQ specific, and
- counselling services



- 1. Educate city councils and decision makers.
- 2. Increase housing options for people experiencing homelessness.
- 3. Increase primary care, mental health and addiction services, and other supports for street involved and vulnerable populations.
- 4. Collaborate with other key sector partners to discharge people directly into housing with supports.
