







NVCA watershed

- Success through partnerships (Rotary&Brereton Field Naturalist)











NVCA priorities

- Through partnerships











Program Flood and Erosion Hazard Prevention

- Data is available for flood & drought forecasting and tracking
- Issued 10 15 Flood Hazard messages
- supports municipalities in Emergency Response and Land use planning
- Target 0 lives lost and minimal property damage






- 9,000 students in 2010

- Target 8,000 students plus residents per year






Program: Conservation Land Management

- Target 12 % protected landscape








2011 Proposed Budget


- Maintain level of service, minimize levy increase
- 6.41% increase for Barrie over 2010, to \$305,994 = \$18,421 or total \$9.43/ resident
- CVA + 2.4% over 2010 (growth + Innisfil lands)
- 3-4% per year pop. Growth
- Average Municipal NVCA levy increase 3.96%
- Fixed costs added 2.0%, salaries, cost of living, all other costs added 1.96%
- NVCA budget 2011, \$4.1 Million, Levy \$1.9 M.

- Need to reduce levy increase, to 2 % +/-??
- Maintain level of service
- Consider:
 - reserve use (currently at ~\$900,000)
 - find efficiencies eg., governance change, per diems, staff COLA/CPI
 - surplus from 2010 applied against 2011...
 - Including growth in process
 - NVCA Board revisits budget March 26th.
