AWARDS AND RECOGNITIONS

21-A-015 RECOGNITION OF THE 2020 HERITAGE BARRIE AWARD RECIPIENTS

Councillor, C. Riepma, Chair of the Heritage Barrie Committee announced that Heritage Week is being held next week, February 15 - 21, 2021.

Councillor Riepma announced the following three recipients of the 2020 Heritage Barrie Awards:

- 62 William Street, Patton House, Ward 8;
- 24 Collier Street, Trinity Anglican Church, Ward 2; and
- 113 Collier Street, Ward 2.

Councillor, J. Harris provided an overview on the historical significance and features of the Victorian home commonly known as the Patton House. He recognized the owner of 62 William Street, Elizabeth Dauphinee Andrews for her efforts to preserve and share the property's history with the community.

Councillor, K. Aylwin provided an overview on the history and gothic style of Trinity Anglican Church, built in 1864, and located at 24 Collier Street. He recognized Trinity Anglican Church for its continued use of a heritage building and diligent stewardship to enrich the community with a connection to the past.

Councillor Aylwin provided an overview on the classic gothic architecture at 113 Collier Street, believed to be built between 125-145 years ago. He recognized the home's excellent stewardship and that it plays an important role in maintaining the historical character of Collier Street's east end.

Councillor Riepma thanked all the nominees, and the Heritage Barrie Committee's hard work this year, and he acknowledged the support from City staff.

Joy Packham on behalf of the Trinity Anglican Church, Kris Menzies on behalf of 113 Collier Street and Elizabeth Dauphinee Andrews, owner of 62 William Street, thanked the Heritage Barrie Committee and members of Council for the recognition and acknowledgement of their heritage properties through the Heritage Barrie Awards.
