That in the period between adoption of the Development Charges By-law and the approval of a new Community Improvement Plan under the Planning Act, the eligibility requirements and evaluation criteria identified in paragraphs 16 to 21 of Staff Report PLN022-19, be used to assess development projects for affordable housing and development in the Urban Growth Centre.
